Sunrise Period

Sunrise notice: from now on to February 21, 2016

Sunrise Period: February 22, 2016 to March 26, 2016

1. Eligibility Requirements

The Sunrise Registration follows "First-come, first served" principle.

Eligible Sunrise Registrants are those who have valid SMD files (Signed Mark Data files) issued by TMCH.

The registered domain names should be matching the names contained in the submitted SMD files

When registering names, the registrant should also submit accompanying credential documentation, including but no limited to business certificate and other credentials to prove the identification of the registrant.

In addition to that, the domain names shall be compliant with all registry policies, including but not limited to string policy, reserved name policy. Such policies shall be published on the website of the Registry operator at http://tele-info.cn or such other URL as the Registry may designate.

2. Sunrise Fees

Fees that are payable during Sunrise include:

- ✓ Sunrise Domain Registration Fee;
- ✓ The renewal fee for domain names registered during Sunrise.

Sunrise Registration fee is non-refundable once the registration is successful.

3. Sunrise Dispute Resolution

Challenges to Sunrise Registrations on the following grounds may be filed with National Arbitration Forum ("Forum") in accordance with the SDRP and the Forum's Rules available at http://www.adrforum.com/RegistrySpec:

a. at the time the challenged domain name was registered, the registrant did not hold a trademark registration of national effect (or regional effect) or the trademark had not been court-validated or protected by statute or treaty;

b. the domain name is not identical to the mark on which the registrant based its

Sunrise Registration; or

c. the trademark registration on which the registrant based its Sunrise Registration is not of national effect (or regional effect) or the trademark had not been court validated or protected by statute or treaty.
